Report on 65th Annual Reunion 2014

Good food, frosty beverages, and good friends came together at the right time and place to create a very pleasant experience. Garry Randall organized it, and he and Donna did an excellent job of making this event a success with help from Terry, Chucky, and a number of others.

• *The Atlantic Canadian Military History Association* set up an excellent display at the Legion for Saturday's registration with WWII artifacts, kit, uniforms, and weapons. Many of our members were quite interested in this welcome addition to our Reunion.

• Our new Regimental Coin arrived late on Saturday, but we were able to issue this top-quality coin to all members in good standing. Some people bought extra coins as gifts for friends or family members, and overall, this project to commemorate those West Novas who died in WWII was very well received.

"True North, Strong and Free" 25 Oct 2014

On the 20th of October 2014, Warrant Officer Patrice Vincent was killed by being struck with a vehicle at St-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Que because he was a member of the Canadian Forces. On the 22nd of October, a violent attack was carried out in Ottawa where a soldier was shot and killed while standing guard at the National War Memorial close to the Parliament Buildings. The nation was in shock after such brazen attacks and such a cowardly act of shooting a soldier, Corporal Nathan Cirillo of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. National direction was given by DND to all our servicemen and women to not wear uniform in public.



A number of veterans across the country took this assault on our nation and on our military as a challenge. The word quickly went out through social media and other means that we must show that we will not pull back at the threat of attack. These veterans dressed as they would for Remembrance Day and took up posts the next day at many War Memorials and Cenotaphs all across the country. I'm sure that you'll be pleased to know that the cenotaph at Kentville numbered among those that were guarded. Veterans from the local area stood guard and, with two West Nova soldiers, Travis and Joseph. With a number of interested civilians who came to watch, they sang "O Canada" together. Those who stood guard that day included Garry Randall, Terry Randall, Gerald "Duke" Davidson, Donn Mills, and Jon VanZoost of the Royal Canadian Legion. Thank you, Gentlemen.

EXERCISE SEMPER TOWN

Windsor residents going through the drive-thru at a downtown restaurant early Sunday morning may have been surprised by RCMP and Military Police roadblocks and the sounds of blank small-arms fire.

These noises were the result of a Reserve military weekend exercise. The West Nova Scotia Regiment with platoons from Bridgewater, Middleton, Kentville and Windsor deployed to the town of Windsor, setting up a company position in the gymnasium of Kings-Edgehill School.

Armed with blank ammunition, troops patrolled the streets looking for a mock military group and their cache of weapons. Information obtained from the patrols led the troops to a small, suspect building on the shores of Pesaquid Lake. Just before first light on Sunday

February 8th, about 45 soldiers converged and surrounded the building. Police forces blocked roads while soldiers stormed the building. After a short skirmish, troops seized the building, the weapons cache was discovered and the suspects were turned over to the police. By Sunday afternoon the military Reserve force of over 75 soldiers returned to their home units ending Exercise Semper Town.

Not only was this a great training opportunity for the soldiers, it also enabled the Regiment to practice coordinating with civilian organizations. According to Captain Wigmore, Company Commander, "We're able to build professional relationships with our civilian partners, while exercising our leaders and soldiers under some of the most realistic conditions possible."

The West Nova Scotia Regiment is an infantry unit headquartered at Camp Aldershot, Kentville and comprises of four platoons located in Bridgewater, Windsor, Kentville and Middleton. The West Nova Scotia Regiment is part of 36 Brigade (Nova Scotia) and 5th Canadian Division (Atlantic Canada).



West Nova Cadet News



One of the WNSR affiliated Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps has been awarded the Strathcona Trophy as the Best Army Cadet Corps in Nova Scotia. What's more is that this corps has won that award in each of the last three years that it was awarded. That corps is 2444 Kings County RCACC in Camp Aldershot. On 5 November 2015 at the Aldershot Drill Hall where the corps parades, Maj (Retd) Ken Hynes, Past President of the Army Cadet League of Nova Scotia, presented the prestigious trophy. There are 28 Army Cadet Corps in communities across Nova Scotia, and 2444 Corps is among the largest in the province at about 70 cadets between the ages of 12 and 18.

Asked what the secret is to maintaining such high numbers, especially among those aged 16 to 18, Captain Mandy Forbes, the Corps' Commanding Officer, says, "We engage them and have them be part of the planning, ask their opinions, give them leadership roles, and let them lead as much as possible."

Matching summer training opportunities and responsibilities at the unit with the cadets' personal interests helps also. Holding youth accountable, and allowing them to make mistakes works well under guidance from Captain Forbes and her staff.



Regimental Coin



If you paid your Regimental Association dues for 2014, you have a Regimental Coin. If you join the Association this year, you'll get a Regimental Coin as part of your membership.

Some members have already requested coins to commemorate those from the remaining part of the alphabet such as Pte Walter Peach and Pte GW Jacques. A list of the names still available appears on the last

page of this newsletter. If there is a special soldier whom you wish to honour by the purchase of his Memorial coin, you can send a request by email to bertf@eastlink.ca. Our plan is to order the requested coins when we are able to make an order of 100 coins. The Memorial coins will each be one of a kind; that is, a soldier's name will not be used a second time.

"West Novas" Reprinted History

The Association still has some of our histories for sale. This well-written 326 page, hard covered book recounts the history of the West Novas from the time the Annapolis and Lunenburg Regiments were amalgamated to form the

Regiment. Most of the book provides a detailed account of the Regiment overseas during World War II. Writing this book involved a great deal of collaboration with West Nova vets whom the author interviewed to get a true picture of what happened inside the Regiment during WWII. In almost every chapter, you'll find the names of individual soldiers and officers who distinguished themselves on the field of battle. As well, there are 42 pages of photos and maps from the war years.

A Pilgrimage to Ortona, Italy

One of the most outstanding and memorable battles of the Italian Campaign for the West Nova Scotia Regiment was



undoubtedly the battle for Ortona, 20-28 December 1944. The battle was sometimes called "Little Stalingrad" because of the deadliness of its close-quarters combat where the soldiers of 1st Canadian Division came face-to-face with paratroopers of the German 1st Parachute Division and won another Canadian victory. The image at the left shows the level of destruction in Ortona as depicted by Canadian war artist Charles Comfort.

A group within the Regimental Association has made a plan to conduct a battlefield tour of Italy, following the footsteps of the Regiment from Potenza to Campobasso, Gambatesa, Castel di Sangro, arriving in Ortona. The centrepiece of this journey would be Remembrance Day ceremonies 2015 at the historic battle site of Ortona and nearby the Moro River Canadian War Cemetery where 1,375 Canadians are buried, including 103 West Novas.

Our tour would begin very early in November 2015, and the itinerary would last for 16 days, including sites such as Monte Cassino, Pompei, Potenza, Foggia, Campobasso, Gambatesa, Castel di Sangro, Ortona, and Rome. The daily rate for the tour would be about \$250 a day and would include hotels with breakfast and dinner daily, planned excursions, all ground transportation for the duration as well several days in Rome with passes for sightseeing in the "Eternal City."

At this time, we would like to see who might be interested in participating in such a tour. We'll commence planning when we see that we have a group large enough to proceed. Fifteen or more participants would be a nice sized group to visit Italy when the weather is still mild and most of the tourists have gone home. The experienced guide, Gren Jones, is a member of the Regimental Association and will accommodate any reasonable request and assist participants in any way possible to make this a memorable trip.
